Reading Thursday

Supporting reading at Mile Cross Primary has been central to the fantastic results our pupils make and their life chances in the future. That is why we promote reading so much right across the school.

Just as important as the school promoting reading, children sharing their books with parents and parents reading to them is so valuable. That is why we are restarting "Reading Thursdays."

When is Reading Thursday?

It is usually the first Thursday of the Month (if that clashes with a school holiday then it is the next Thursday after that). The next Reading Thursday is 15th September - NEXT **THURSDAY**

What is Reading Thursday?

It's your chance to come in to school, read with your child in school and find our more about what they are reading in school.

What time is Reading Thursday?

Times are 8:30 to 9:00. You can come straight in to class with your child, but sessions finish strictly at 9:00 as we then have to start normal lessons.

So we look forward to you bringing your child in to class and reading with them, from Nursery to Year 6 next Thursday.

The Covid rules for this year



If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should stay at home for **3 days** and keep away from people.



If they feel well and have no temperature after 3 days, the risk of giving COVID-19 to someone else is low



Children and young people should keep going to school, college or childcare as usual, even if they live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test.

Taken from the UK Government advice to schools

Rules summary:

If someone else (not your child) in your household has Covid-19, but your child is well and has no symptoms

- Your child can come to school

If your child develops symptoms and is unwell after someone in your household has recently had Covid-19

- Your child can come back to school if they have no temperature and feel well after 3 days.

If an adult in school gets Covid, what is the school doing to keep children safe?

- Adults can return after 5 days if they have no temperature or symptoms (5 not 3 days because adults take longer to recover).

If you suspect your child has Covid-19, please follow the rules to help keep other pupils and staff safe
