Resilience - Our assembly focus for this term

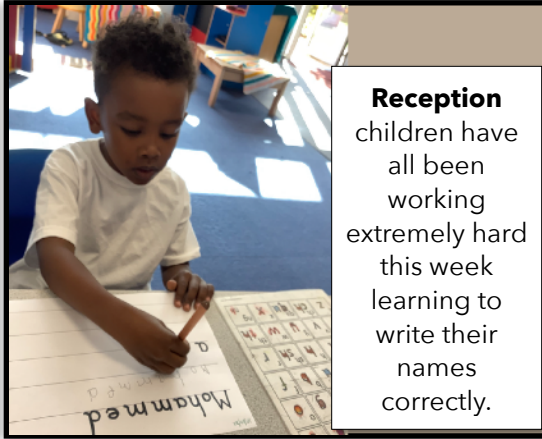
A focus of whole school assemblies this term has been resilience and how children can overcome difficulties and worries to be successful.

One of the main things we have promoted is the idea that making mistakes is a common human trait and that making a mistake is the first step to getting something right next time. We also make a point of rewarding and promoting effort and not giving up. So when you are speaking with your child, ask them if they made any mistakes, ask them how they dealt with that, what they learnt and praise them for not giving up. All these things promote the idea of being resilient and help children to become better learners.

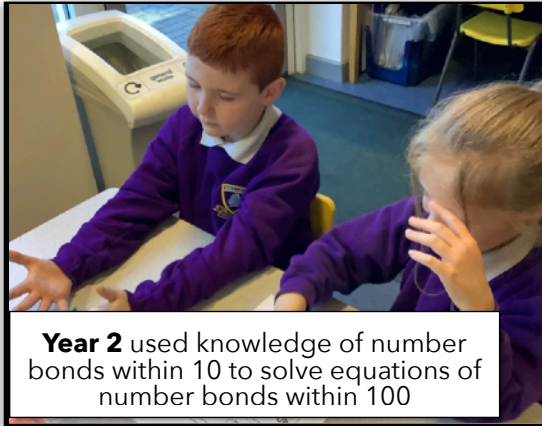
Nursery made faces from fruit and leaves



Reception children have all been working extremely hard this week learning to write their names correctly.



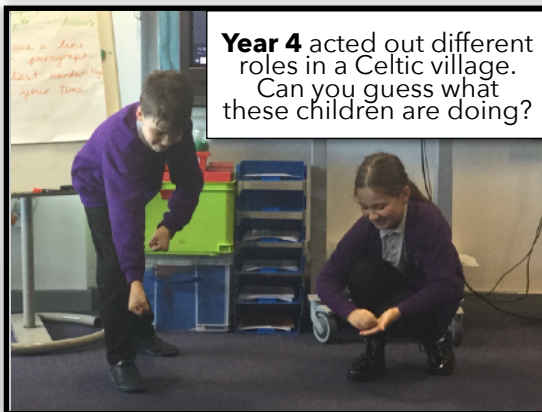
In RE, **Year 1** made their own creations and discussed how they would feel if somebody broke them



Year 2 used knowledge of number bonds within 10 to solve equations of number bonds within 100



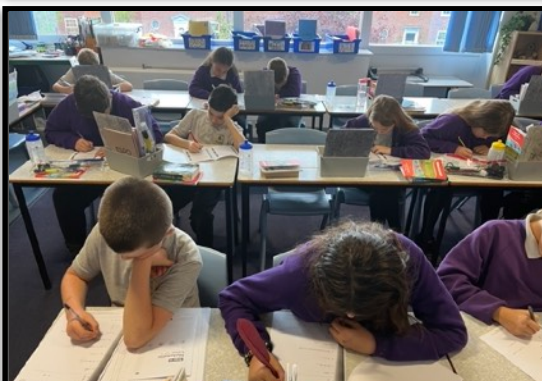
Year 3 shared our Forest School session about the Stone Age with their families! Thank you to everyone who came
